



i.C.A.R.E is a cyclic methodology for academic study and improvement and signifies the following:

- Intention set a goal.
- **Collaboration** work with others who have strengths in your areas of weakness to improve.
- Action action your goal with set scaffolds.
- **Reflection** reflect at assessment time upon your achievements from that goal setting.
- **Evaluation** re-evaluate your position and what you still need to do to improve.

This year we celebrated our 'top guns' – the largest group of Year 12 boys that the College has seen in many years, who have been tracking towards a predicted ATAR above 95. Additionally, we highlighted the continued efforts of more than 25 boys who worked towards improving their overall marks by five, across all subjects through internal assessments.

I was particularly proud of how this cohort embraced our unofficial motto "if we all do well ... we all do well" demonstrating that success is a team effort and we are only as strong as our weakest link.

You have set the bar high, embraced our drive for academic excellence and delivered where it counts. I could not be prouder.


